#### 188. 6-July Daily Reading (Prophets and Writings).

# 1 Kings 7.

## 1 . Solomon's Other Buildings. .

Solomon was building his own house thirteen years, and he finished all his house.

- 2 For he built the house of the forest of Lebanon; its length was one hundred cubits, and its breadth fifty cubits, and its height thirty cubits, on four rows of cedar pillars, with cedar beams on the pillars.
- 3 It was covered with cedar above over the forty-five beams, that were on the pillars; fifteen in a row.
- 4 There were beams in three rows, and window was over against window in three ranks.
- 5 All the doors and posts were made square with beams: and window was over against window in three ranks.
- 6 He made the porch of pillars; its length was fifty cubits, and its breadth thirty cubits; and a porch before them; and pillars and a threshold before them.
- 7 He made the porch of the throne where he was to judge, even the porch of judgment: and it was covered with cedar from floor to floor.
- 8 His house where he was to dwell, the other court within the porch, was of the like work. He made also a house for Pharaoh's daughter (whom Solomon had taken as wife), like this porch.
- 9 All these were of costly stones, even of cut stone, according to measure, sawed with saws, inside and outside, even from the foundation to the coping, and so on the outside to the great court.
- 10 The foundation was of costly stones, even great stones, stones of ten cubits, and stones of eight cubits.
- 11 Above were costly stones, even cut stone, according to measure, and cedar wood.
- 12 The great court around had three courses of cut stone, and a course of cedar beams; like as the inner court of the house of YAHWEH, and the porch of the house.

#### 13 . Hiram the Craftsman. .

King Solomon sent and fetched Hiram out of Tyre.

14 He was the son of a widow of the tribe of Naphtali, and his father was a man of Tyre, a worker in brass; and he was filled with wisdom and understanding and skill, to work all works in brass. He came to king Solomon, and performed all his work.

#### . The Bronze Pillars for the Temple. .

For he fashioned the two pillars of brass, eighteen cubits high apiece: and a line of twelve cubits encircled either of them about.

- 16 He made two capitals of molten brass, to set on the tops of the pillars: the height of the one capital was five cubits, and the height of the other capital was five cubits.
- 17 There were nets of checker work, and wreaths of chain work, for the capitals which were on the top of the pillars; seven for the one capital, and seven for the other capital.
- 18 So he made the pillars; and there were two rows around on the one network, to cover the capitals that were on the top of the pillars: and he did so for the other capital.
- 19 The capitals that were on the top of the pillars in the porch were of lily work, four cubits.
- 20 There were capitals above also on the two pillars, close by the belly which was beside the network: and the pomegranates were two hundred, in rows around on the other capital.

- 21 He set up the pillars at the porch of the temple: and he set up the right pillar, and called its name Jachin; and he set up the left pillar, and called its name Boaz.
- 22 On the top of the pillars was lily work: so was the work of the pillars finished.

#### . The Sea and the Oxen..

He made the molten sea of ten cubits from brim to brim, round in compass, and its height was five cubits; and a line of thirty cubits encircled it.

- 24 Under its brim around there were buds which encircled it, for ten cubits, encircling the sea: the buds were in two rows, cast when it was cast.
- 25 It stood on twelve oxen, three looking toward the north, and three looking toward the west, and three looking toward the south, and three looking toward the east; and the sea was set on them above, and all their hinder parts were inward.
- 26 It was a handbreadth thick: and its brim was worked like the brim of a cup, like the flower of a lily: it held two thousand baths.

#### . The Carts and the Lavers. .

He made the ten bases of brass; four cubits was the length of one base, and four cubits its breadth, and three cubits its height.

- 28 The work of the bases was like this: they had panels; and there were panels between the ledges;
- 29 and on the panels that were between the ledges were lions, oxen, and cherubim; and on the ledges there was a pedestal above; and beneath the lions and oxen were wreaths of hanging work.
- 30 Every base had four bronze wheels, and axles of brass; and the four feet of it had supports: beneath the basin were the supports molten, with wreaths at the side of each.
- 31 The mouth of it within the capital and above was a cubit: and its mouth was round after the work of a pedestal, a cubit and a half; and also on its mouth were engravings, and their panels were foursquare, not round.
- 32 The four wheels were underneath the panels; and the axles of the wheels were in the base: and the height of a wheel was a cubit and half a cubit.
- 33 The work of the wheels was like the work of a chariot wheel: their axles, and their rims, and their spokes, and their naves, were all molten.
- 34 There were four supports at the four corners of each base: its supports were of the base itself.
- 35 In the top of the base was there a round compass half a cubit high; and on the top of the base its stays and its panels were of the same.
- 36 On the plates of its stays, and on its panels, he engraved cherubim, lions, and palm trees, according to the space of each, with wreaths all around.
- 37 In this way, he made the ten bases: all of them had one casting, one measure, and one form.
- 38 He made ten basins of brass: one basin contained forty baths; and every basin was four cubits; and on every one of the ten bases one basin.
- 39 He set the bases, five on the right side of the house, and five on the left side of the house: and he set the sea on the right side of the house eastward, toward the south.

#### 40 . Furnishings of the Temple. .

Hiram made the basins, and the shovels, and the basins. So Hiram made an end of doing all the work that he worked for king Solomon in the house of YAHWEH:

41 the two pillars, and the two bowls of the capitals that were on the top of the pillars;

and the two networks to cover the two bowls of the capitals that were on the top of the pillars;

- 42 and the four hundred pomegranates for the two networks; two rows of pomegranates for each network, to cover the two bowls of the capitals that were on the pillars;
- 43 and the ten bases, and the ten basins on the bases;
- 44 and the one sea, and the twelve oxen under the sea;
- 45 and the pots, and the shovels, and the basins: even all these vessels, which Hiram made for king Solomon, in the house of YAHWEH, were of burnished brass.
- 46 The king cast them in the plain of the Jordan, in the clay ground between Succoth and Zarethan.
- 47 Solomon left all the vessels unweighed, because they were exceeding many: the weight of the brass could not be found out.
- 48 Solomon made all the vessels that were in the house of YAHWEH: the golden altar, and the table whereupon the show bread was, of gold;
- 49 and the menorahs, five on the right side, and five on the left, before the oracle, of pure gold; and the flowers, and the lamps, and the tongs, of gold;
- 50 and the cups, and the snuffers, and the basins, and the spoons, and the fire pans, of pure gold; and the hinges, both for the doors of the inner house, the most holy place, and for the doors of the house, of the temple, of gold.
- 51 Thus all the work that king Solomon worked in the house of YAHWEH was finished. Solomon brought in the things which David his father had dedicated, the silver, and the gold, and the vessels, and put them in the treasuries of the house of YAHWEH!

#### Hosea 9:1-16.

## . Judgment of Israel's Sin. .

Don't rejoice, Israel, to jubilation like the nations; for you were unfaithful to your ELOHIM! You love the wages of a prostitute at every grain threshing floor.

- 2 The threshing floor and the winepress won't feed them, and the new wine will fail her.
- 3 They won't dwell in YAHWEH's land; but Ephraim will return to Egypt, and they will eat unclean food in Assyria.
- 4 They won't pour out wine offerings to YAHWEH, neither will they be pleasing to him. Their sacrifices will be to them like the bread of mourners; all who eat of it will be polluted; for their bread will be for their appetite. It will not come into the house of YAHWEH!
- 5 What will you do in the day of solemn assembly, and in the day of the feast of YAHWEH?
- 6 For, behold, they have gone away from destruction. Egypt will gather them up. Memphis will bury them. Nettles will possess their pleasant things of silver. Thorns will be in their tents.
- 7 The days of visitation have come. The days of reckoning have come. Israel will consider the prophet to be a fool, and the man who is inspired to be insane, because of the abundance of your sins, and because your hostility is great.
- 8 A prophet watches over Ephraim with my ELOHIM! A fowler's snare is on all of his paths, and hostility in the house of his ELOHIM!
- 9 They have deeply corrupted themselves, as in the days of Gibeah. He will remember their iniquity. He will punish them for their sins.
- 10 I found Israel like grapes in the wilderness. I saw your fathers as the first ripe in the fig tree at its first season; but they came to Baal Peor, and consecrated themselves to the shameful thing, and became abominable like that which they loved.
- 11 As for Ephraim, their glory will fly away like a bird. There will be no birth, none with

child, and no conception.

- 12 Though they bring up their children, yet I will bereave them, so that not a man shall be left. Indeed, woe also to them when I depart from them!
- 13 I have seen Ephraim, like Tyre, planted in a pleasant place; but Ephraim will bring out his children to the murderer.
- 14 Give them YAHWEH what will you give? Give them a miscarrying womb and dry breasts.
- 15 "All their wickedness is in Gilgal; for there I hated them. Because of the wickedness of their deeds I will drive them out of my house! I will love them no more. All their princes are rebels.
- 16 Ephraim is struck. Their root has dried up. They will bear no fruit. Even though they bring forth, yet I will kill the beloved ones of their womb."

## Psalms 7.

# 1 . A Meditation of David, which he sang to YAHWEH concerning the words of Cush, a Benjamite...

A meditation by David, which he sang to YAHWEH, concerning the words of Cush, the Benjamite. YAHWEH, my ELOHIM, I take refuge in you. Save me from all those who pursue me, and deliver me,

- 2 lest they tear apart my soul like a lion, ripping it in pieces, while there is none to deliver.
- 3 YAHWEH, my ELOHIM, if I have done this, if there is iniquity in my hands,
- 4 if I have rewarded evil to him who was at peace with me (yes, if I have delivered him who without cause was my adversary),
- 5 let the enemy pursue my soul, and overtake it; yes, let him tread my life down to the earth, and lay my glory in the dust. Selah.
- 6 Arise, YAHWEH, in your anger. Lift up yourself against the rage of my adversaries. Awake for me. You have commanded judgment.
- 7 Let the congregation of the peoples surround you. Rule over them on high.
- 8 YAHWEH administers judgment to the peoples. Judge me, YAHWEH, according to my righteousness, and to my integrity that is in me.
- 9 Oh let the wickedness of the wicked come to an end, but establish the righteous; their minds and hearts are searched by the righteous ELOHIM!
- 10 My shield is with ELOHIM, who saves the upright in heart.
- 11 ELOHIM is a righteous judge, yes, an EL who has indignation every day.
- 12 If a man doesn't relent, he will sharpen his sword; he has bent and strung his bow.
- 13 He has also prepared for himself the instruments of death. He makes ready his flaming arrows.
- 14 Behold, he travails with iniquity. Yes, he has conceived mischief, and brought forth falsehood.
- 15 He has dug a hole, and has fallen into the pit which he made.
- 16 The trouble he causes shall return to his own head. His violence shall come down on the crown of his own head.
- 17 I will give thanks to YAHWEH according to his righteousness, and will sing praise to the name of YAHWEH Most High.

#### Proverbs 22.

1 A good name is more desirable than great riches, and loving favor is better than silver and gold.

- 2 The rich and the poor have this in common: YAHWEH is the maker of them all.
- 3 A prudent man sees danger, and hides himself; but the simple pass on, and suffer for it.
- 4 The result of humility and the fear of YAHWEH is wealth, honor, and life.
- 5 Thorns and snares are in the path of the wicked: whoever guards his soul stays from them.
- 6 Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.
- 7 The rich rule over the poor. The borrower is servant to the lender.
- 8 He who sows wickedness reaps trouble, and the rod of his fury will be destroyed.
- 9 He who has a generous eye will be blessed; for he shares his food with the poor.
- 10 Drive out the mocker, and strife will go out; yes, quarrels and insults will stop.
- 11 He who loves purity of heart and speaks gracefully is the king's friend.
- 12 The eyes of YAHWEH watch over knowledge; but he frustrates the words of the unfaithful.
- 13 The sluggard says, "There is a lion outside! I will be killed in the streets!"
- 14 The mouth of an adulteress is a deep pit: he who is under YAHWEH's wrath will fall into it.
- 15 Folly is bound up in the heart of a child: the rod of discipline drives it far from him.
- 16 Whoever oppresses the poor for his own increase and whoever gives to the rich, both come to poverty.

#### . Sayings of the Wise. .

Turn your ear, and listen to the words of the wise. Apply your heart to my teaching.

18 For it is a pleasant thing if you keep them within you, if all of them are ready on your

- lips.

  19 That your trust may be in YAHWEH, I teach you today, even you.
- 20 Haven't I written to you thirty excellent things of counsel and knowledge,
- 21 To teach you truth, reliable words, to give sound answers to the ones who sent you?
- 22 Don't exploit the poor, because he is poor; and don't crush the needy in court;
- 23 for YAHWEH will plead their case, and plunder the life of those who plunder them.
- 24 Don't befriend a hot-tempered man, and don't associate with one who harbors anger:
- 25 lest you learn his ways, and ensuare your soul.
- 26 Don't you be one of those who strike hands, of those who are collateral for debts.
- 27 If you don't have means to pay, why should he take away your bed from under you?
- 28 Don't move the ancient boundary stone, which your fathers have set up.
- 29 Do you see a man skilled in his work? He will serve kings. He won't serve obscure men.
