192. 10-July Daily Reading (Prophets and Writings).

1 Kings 11.

Solomon's Heart Turns from YAHWEH.

Now king Solomon loved many foreign women, together with the daughter of Pharaoh, women of the Moabites, Ammonites, Edomites, Sidonians, and Hittites;

- 2 of the nations concerning which YAHWEH said to the children of Israel, "You shall not go among them, neither shall they come among you; for surely they will turn away your heart after their gods." Solomon joined to these in love.
- 3 He had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines; and his wives turned away his heart.
- 4 For it happened, when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other gods; and his heart was not perfect with YAHWEH his ELOHIM, as was the heart of David his father.
- 5 For Solomon went after Ashtoreth the goddess of the Sidonians, and after Milcom the abomination of the Ammonites.
- 6 Solomon did that which was evil in the sight of YAHWEH, and didn't go fully after YAHWEH, as did David his father.
- 7 Then Solomon built a high place for Chemosh the abomination of Moab, on the mountain that is before Jerusalem, and for Molech the abomination of the children of Ammon.
- 8 So he did for all his foreign wives, who burnt incense and sacrificed to their gods.
- 9 YAHWEH was angry with Solomon, because his heart was turned away from YAHWEH, the ELOHIM of Israel, who had appeared to him twice,
- 10 and had commanded him concerning this thing, that he should not go after other gods: but he didn't keep that which YAHWEH commanded.
- 11 Therefore YAHWEH said to Solomon, "Because this is done by you, and you have not kept my covenant and my statutes, which I have commanded you, I will surely tear the kingdom from you, and will give it to your servant.
- 12 Notwithstanding I will not do it in your days, for David your father's sake; but I will tear it out of the hand of your son.
- 13 However I will not tear away all the kingdom; but I will give one tribe to your son, for David my servant's sake, and for Jerusalem's sake which I have chosen."

14 . Adversaries of Solomon. .

YAHWEH raised up an adversary to Solomon, Hadad the Edomite: he was of the king's seed in Edom.

- 15 For it happened, when David was in Edom, and Joab the captain of the army was gone up to bury the slain, and had struck every male in Edom
- 16 (for Joab and all Israel remained there six months, until he had cut off every male in Edom):
- 17 that Hadad fled, he and certain Edomites of his father's servants with him, to go into Egypt, Hadad being yet a little child.
- 18 They arose out of Midian, and came to Paran; and they took men with them out of Paran, and they came to Egypt, to Pharaoh king of Egypt, who gave him a house, and appointed him food, and gave him land.
- 19 Hadad found great favor in the sight of Pharaoh, so that he gave him as wife the sister of his own wife, the sister of Tahpenes the queen.
- 20 The sister of Tahpenes bore him Genubath his son, whom Tahpenes weaned in Pharaoh's house; and Genubath was in Pharaoh's house among the sons of Pharaoh.

- 21 When Hadad heard in Egypt that David slept with his fathers, and that Joab the captain of the army was dead, Hadad said to Pharaoh, "Let me depart, that I may go to my own country."
- 22 Then Pharaoh said to him, "But what have you lacked with me, that behold, you seek to go to your own country?" He answered, "Nothing, however only let me depart."
- 23 ELOHIM raised up an adversary to him, Rezon the son of Eliada, who had fled from his master Hadadezer king of Zobah.
- 24 He gathered men to him, and became captain over a troop, when David killed them of Zobah: and they went to Damascus, and lived therein, and reigned in Damascus.
- 25 He was an adversary to Israel all the days of Solomon, besides the mischief of Hadad: and he abhorred Israel, and reigned over Syria.

. Jeroboam's Rebellion. .

Jeroboam the son of Nebat, an Ephraimite of Zeredah, a servant of Solomon, whose mother's name was Zeruah, a widow, he also lifted up his hand against the king.

- 27 This was the reason why he lifted up his hand against the king: Solomon built Millo, and repaired the breach of the city of David his father.
- 28 The man Jeroboam was a mighty man of valor; and Solomon saw the young man that he was industrious, and he put him in charge of all the labor of the house of Joseph.
- 29 It happened at that time, when Jeroboam went out of Jerusalem, that the prophet Ahijah the Shilonite found him in the way; now Ahijah had clad himself with a new garment; and they two were alone in the field.
- 30 Ahijah laid hold of the new garment that was on him, and tore it in twelve pieces.
- 31 He said to Jeroboam, "Take ten pieces; for thus says YAHWEH, the ELOHIM of Israel, 'Behold, I will tear the kingdom out of the hand of Solomon, and will give ten tribes to you
- 32 (but he shall have one tribe, for my servant David's sake and for Jerusalem's sake, the city which I have chosen out of all the tribes of Israel);
- 33 because that they have forsaken me, and have worshiped Ashtoreth the goddess of the Sidonians, Chemosh the god of Moab, and Milcom the god of the children of Ammon. They have not walked in my ways, to do that which is right in my eyes, and to keep my statutes and my ordinances, as David his father did.
- 34 "However I will not take the whole kingdom out of his hand; but I will make him prince all the days of his life, for David my servant's sake whom I chose, who kept my commandments and my statutes;
- 35 but I will take the kingdom out of his son's hand, and will give it to you, even ten tribes.
- 36 To his son will I give one tribe, that David my servant may have a lamp always before me in Jerusalem, the city which I have chosen me to put my name there.
- 37 I will take you, and you shall reign according to all that your soul desires, and shall be king over Israel.
- 38 It shall be, if you will listen to all that I command you, and will walk in my ways, and do that which is right in my eyes, to keep my statutes and my commandments, as David my servant did; that I will be with you, and will build you a sure house, as I built for David, and will give Israel to you.
- 39 I will for this afflict the seed of David, but not forever."
- 40 Solomon sought therefore to kill Jeroboam; but Jeroboam arose, and fled into Egypt, to Shishak king of Egypt, and was in Egypt until the death of Solomon.

<u>. Death of Solomon.</u>

Now the rest of the acts of Solomon, and all that he did, and his wisdom, aren't they written in the book of the acts of Solomon?

- 42 The time that Solomon reigned in Jerusalem over all Israel was forty years.
- 43 Solomon slept with his fathers, and was buried in the city of David his father: and Rehoboam his son reigned in his place.

Hosea 13.

<u>Relentless Judgment on Israel.</u>

When Ephraim spoke, there was trembling. He exalted himself in Israel, but when he became guilty in Baal, he died.

- 2 Now they sin more and more, and have made themselves molten images of their silver, even idols according to their own understanding, all of them the work of the craftsmen. They say of them, 'They offer human sacrifice and kiss the calves.'
- 3 Therefore they will be like the morning mist, and like the dew that passes away early, like the chaff that is driven with the whirlwind out of the threshing floor, and like the smoke out of the chimney.
- 4 "Yet I am YAHWEH your ELOHIM from the land of Egypt; and you shall acknowledge no god but me, and besides me there is no savior.
- 5 I knew you in the wilderness, in the land of great drought.
- 6 According to their pasture, so were they filled; they were filled, and their heart was exalted. Therefore they have forgotten me.
- 7 Therefore I am like a lion to them. Like a leopard, I will lurk by the path.
- 8 I will meet them like a bear that is bereaved of her cubs, and will tear the covering of their heart. There I will devour them like a lioness. The wild animal will tear them.
- 9 You are destroyed, Israel, because you are against me, against your help.
- 10 Where is your king now, that he may save you in all your cities? And your judges, of whom you said, 'Give me a king and princes?'
- 11 I have given you a king in my anger, and have taken him away in my wrath.
- 12 The guilt of Ephraim is stored up. His sin is stored up.
- 13 The sorrows of a travailing woman will come on him. He is an unwise son; for when it is time, he doesn't come to the opening of the womb.
- 14 I will ransom them from the power of Sheol. I will redeem them from death! Death, where are your plagues? Sheol, where is your destruction? "Compassion will be hidden from my eyes.
- 15 Though he is fruitful among his brothers, an east wind will come, the breath of YAHWEH coming up from the wilderness; and his spring will become dry, and his fountain will be dried up. He will plunder the storehouse of treasure.
- 16 Samaria will bear her guilt; for she has rebelled against her ELOHIM! They will fall by the sword. Their infants will be dashed in pieces, and their pregnant women will be ripped open."

Psalms 11.

1 . To the Chief Musician. A Psalm of David...

For the Chief Musician. By David. In YAHWEH, I take refuge. How can you say to my soul, "Flee as a bird to your mountain!"

- 2 For, behold, the wicked bend their bows. They set their arrows on the strings, that they may shoot in darkness at the upright in heart.
- 3 If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?

- 4 YAHWEH is in his holy temple. YAHWEH is on his throne in heaven. His eyes observe. His eyes examine the children of men.
- 5 YAHWEH examines the righteous, but the wicked and him who loves violence his soul hates.
- 6 On the wicked he will rain blazing coals; fire, sulfur, and scorching wind shall be the portion of their cup.
- 7 For YAHWEH is righteous. He loves righteousness. The upright shall see his face.

Proverbs 26.

- 1 Like snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honor is not fitting for a fool.
- 2 Like a fluttering sparrow, like a darting swallow, so the undeserved curse doesn't come to rest.
- 3 A whip is for the horse, a bridle for the donkey, and a rod for the back of fools!
- 4 Don't answer a fool according to his folly, lest you also be like him.
- 5 Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own eyes.
- 6 One who sends a message by the hand of a fool is cutting off feet and drinking violence.
- 7 Like the legs of the lame that hang loose: so is a parable in the mouth of fools.
- 8 As one who binds a stone in a sling, so is he who gives honor to a fool.
- 9 Like a thornbush that goes into the hand of a drunkard, so is a parable in the mouth of fools.
- 10 As an archer who wounds all, so is he who hires a fool or he who hires those who pass by.
- 11 As a dog that returns to his vomit, so is a fool who repeats his folly.
- 12 Do you see a man wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him.
- 13 The sluggard says, "There is a lion in the road! A fierce lion roams the streets!"
- 14 As the door turns on its hinges, so does the sluggard on his bed.
- 15 The sluggard buries his hand in the dish. He is too lazy to bring it back to his mouth.
- 16 The sluggard is wiser in his own eyes than seven men who answer with discretion.
- 17 Like one who grabs a dog's ears is one who passes by and meddles in a quarrel not his own.
- 18 Like a madman who shoots torches, arrows, and death,
- 19 is the man who deceives his neighbor and says, "Am I not joking?"
- 20 For lack of wood a fire goes out. Without gossip, a quarrel dies down.
- 21 As coals are to hot embers, and wood to fire, so is a contentious man to kindling strife.
- 22 The words of a whisperer are as dainty morsels, they go down into the innermost parts.
- 23 Like silver dross on an earthen vessel are the lips of a fervent one with an evil heart.
- 24 A malicious man disguises himself with his lips, but he harbors evil in his heart.
- 25 When his speech is charming, don't believe him; for there are seven abominations in his heart.
- 26 His malice may be concealed by deception, but his wickedness will be exposed in the assembly.
- 27 Whoever digs a pit shall fall into it. Whoever rolls a stone, it will come back on him.
- 28 A lying tongue hates those it hurts; and a flattering mouth works ruin.
