Job 9.

1. Job: There Is No Mediator. .

Then Job answered.

- 2 "Truly I know that it is so, but how can man be just with EL?
- 3 If he is pleased to contend with him, he can't answer him one time in a thousand.
- 4 ELOHIM who is wise in heart, and mighty in strength: who has hardened himself against him, and prospered?
- 5 He removes the mountains, and they don't know it, when he overturns them in his anger.
- 6 He shakes the earth out of its place. Its pillars tremble.
- 7 He commands the sun, and it doesn't rise, and seals up the stars.
- 8 He alone stretches out the heavens, and treads on the waves of the sea.
- 9 He makes the Bear, Orion, and the Pleiades, and the rooms of the south.
- 10 He does great things past finding out; yes, marvelous things without number.
- 11 Behold, he goes by me, and I don't see him. He passes on also, but I don't perceive him.
- 12 Behold, he snatches away. Who can hinder him? Who will ask him, 'What are you doing?'
- 13 "ELOHIM will not withdraw his anger. The helpers of Rahab stoop under him.
- 14 How much less shall I answer him, And choose my words to argue with him?
- 15 Though I were righteous, yet I wouldn't answer him. I would make supplication to my judge.
- 16 If I had called, and he had answered me, yet I wouldn't believe that he listened to my voice.
- 17 For he breaks me with a storm, and multiplies my wounds without cause.
- 18 He will not allow me to catch my breath, but fills me with bitterness.
- 19 If it is a matter of strength, behold, he is mighty! If of justice, 'Who,' says he, 'will summon me?'
- 20 Though I am righteous, my own mouth shall condemn me. Though I am blameless, it shall prove me perverse.
- 21 I am blameless. I don't respect myself. I despise my life.
- 22 "It is all the same. Therefore I say he destroys the blameless and the wicked.
- 23 If the scourge kills suddenly, he will mock at the trial of the innocent.
- 24 The earth is given into the hand of the wicked. He covers the faces of its judges. If not he, then who is it?
- 25 "Now my days are swifter than a runner. They flee away, they see no good,
- 26 They have passed away as the swift ships, as the eagle that swoops on the prey.
- 27 If I say, 'I will forget my complaint, I will put off my sad face, and cheer up;'
- 28 I am afraid of all my sorrows, I know that you will not hold me innocent.
- 29 I shall be condemned. Why then do I labor in vain?
- 30 If I wash myself with snow, and cleanse my hands with lye,
- 31 yet you will plunge me in the ditch. My own clothes shall abhor me.
- 32 For he is not a man, as I am, that I should answer him, that we should come together in judgment.
- 33 There is no umpire between us, that might lay his hand on us both.
- 34 Let him take his rod away from me. Let his terror not make me afraid;
- 35 then I would speak, and not fear him, for I am not so in myself.

Psalms 99.

1. Praise to YHWH for His Holiness...

YHWH reigns! Let the peoples tremble. He sits enthroned among the cherubim. Let the earth be moved.

- 2 YHWH is great in Zion. He is high above all the peoples.
- 3 Let them praise your great and awesome name. He is Holy!
- 4 The King's strength also loves justice. You do establish equity. You execute justice and righteousness in Jacob.
- 5 Exalt YHWH our ELOHIM! Worship at his footstool. He is Holy!
- 6 Moses and Aaron were among his priests, Samuel among those who call on his name; they called on YHWH, and he answered them.
- 7 He spoke to them in the pillar of cloud. They kept his testimonies, the statute that he gave them.
- 8 You answered them, YHWH our ELOHIM! You are an EL who forgave them, although you took vengeance for their doings.
- 9 Exalt YHWH, our ELOHIM! Worship at his holy hill, for YHWH, our ELOHIM, is holy!

Proverbs 27.

- 1 Don't boast about tomorrow; for you don't know what a day may bring forth.
- 2 Let another man praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger, and not your own lips.
- 3 A stone is heavy, and sand is a burden; but a fool's provocation is heavier than both.
- 4 Wrath is cruel, and anger is overwhelming; but who is able to stand before jealousy?
- 5 Better is open rebuke than hidden love.
- 6 Faithful are the wounds of a friend; although the kisses of an enemy are profuse.
- 7 A full soul loathes a honeycomb; but to a hungry soul, every bitter thing is sweet.
- 8 As a bird that wanders from her nest, so is a man who wanders from his home.
- 9 Perfume and incense bring joy to the heart; so does earnest counsel from a man's friend.
- 10 Don't forsake your friend and your father's friend. Don't go to your brother's house in the day of your disaster: better is a neighbor who is near than a distant brother.
- 11 Be wise, my son, and bring joy to my heart, then I can answer my tormentor.
- 12 A prudent man sees danger and takes refuge; but the simple pass on, and suffer for it.
- 13 Take his garment when he puts up collateral for a stranger. Hold it for a wayward woman!
- 14 He who blesses his neighbor with a loud voice early in the morning, it will be taken as a curse by him.
- 15 A continual dropping on a rainy day and a contentious wife are alike:
- 16 restraining her is like restraining the wind, or like grasping oil in his right hand.
- 17 Iron sharpens iron; so a man sharpens his friend's countenance.
- 18 Whoever tends the fig-tree shall eat its fruit. He who looks after his master shall be honored.
- 19 As water reflects a face, so a man's heart reflects the man.
- 20 Sheol and Abaddon are never satisfied; and a man's eves are never satisfied.
- 21 The crucible is for silver, and the furnace for gold; but man is refined by his praise.
- 22 Though you grind a fool in a mortar with a pestle along with grain, yet his foolishness will not be removed from him.
- 23 Know well the state of your flocks, and pay attention to your herds:
- 24 for riches are not forever, nor does even the crown endure to all generations.

- 25 The hay is removed, and the new growth appears, the grasses of the hills are gathered in.
- 26 The lambs are for your clothing, and the goats are the price of a field.
