# Day 102. 11-April Daily Reading (Prophets and Writings).

#### Job 11.

#### 1. Zophar Urges Job to Repent. .

Then Zophar, the Naamathite, answered,

- 2 "Shouldn't the multitude of words be answered? Should a man full of talk be justified?
- 3 Should your boastings make men hold their peace? When you mock, shall no man make you ashamed?
- 4 For you say, 'My doctrine is pure. I am clean in your eyes.'
- 5 But oh that ELOHIM would speak, and open his lips against you,
- 6 that he would show you the secrets of wisdom! For true wisdom has two sides. Know therefore that ELOHIM exacts of you less than your iniquity deserves.
- 7 "Can you fathom the mystery of ELOHIM? Or can you probe the limits of the Almighty?
- 8 They are high as heaven. What can you do? They are deeper than Sheol. What can you know?
- 9 Its measure is longer than the earth, and broader than the sea.
- 10 If he passes by, or confines, or convenes a court, then who can oppose him?
- 11 For he knows false men. He sees iniquity also, even though he doesn't consider it.
- 12 An empty-headed man becomes wise when a man is born as a wild donkey's colt.
- 13 "If you set your heart aright, stretch out your hands toward him.
- 14 If iniquity is in your hand, put it far away. Don't let unrighteousness dwell in your tents
- 15 Surely then you shall lift up your face without spot; Yes, you shall be steadfast, and shall not fear:
- 16 for you shall forget your misery. You shall remember it as waters that are passed away.
- 17 Life shall be clearer than the noonday. Though there is darkness, it shall be as the morning.
- 18 You shall be secure, because there is hope. Yes, you shall search, and shall take your rest in safety.
- 19 Also you shall lie down, and none shall make you afraid. Yes, many shall court your favor.
- 20 But the eyes of the wicked shall fail. They shall have no way to flee. Their hope shall be the giving up of the spirit."

#### Psalms 101.

#### 1. A Psalm of David...

- A Psalm by David. I will sing of loving kindness and justice. To you, YHWH, I will sing praises.
- 2 I will be careful to live a blameless life. When will you come to me? I will walk within my house with a blameless heart.
- 3 I will set no vile thing before my eyes. I hate the deeds of faithless men. They will not cling to me.
- 4 A perverse heart will be far from me. I will have nothing to do with evil.
- 5 I will silence whoever secretly slanders his neighbor. I won't tolerate one who is haughty and conceited.
- 6 My eyes will be on the faithful of the land, that they may dwell with me. He who walks in a perfect way, he will serve me.

Job 11, Psalms 101, Proverbs 29.

- 7 He who practices deceit won't dwell within my house. He who speaks falsehood won't be established before my eyes.
- 8 Morning by morning, I will destroy all the wicked of the land; to cut off all the workers of iniquity from YHWH's city.

#### Proverbs 29.

- 1 He who is often rebuked and stiffens his neck will be destroyed suddenly, with no remedy.
- 2 When the righteous thrive, the people rejoice; but when the wicked rule, the people groan.
- 3 Whoever loves wisdom brings joy to his father; but a companion of prostitutes squanders his wealth.
- 4 The king by justice makes the land stable, but he who takes bribes tears it down.
- 5 A man who flatters his neighbor spreads a net for his feet.
- 6 An evil man is snared by his sin, but the righteous can sing and be glad.
- 7 The righteous care about justice for the poor. The wicked aren't concerned about knowledge.
- 8 Mockers stir up a city, but wise men turn away anger.
- 9 If a wise man goes to court with a foolish man, the fool rages or scoffs, and there is no peace.
- 10 The bloodthirsty hate a man of integrity; and they seek the life of the upright.
- 11 A fool vents all of his anger, but a wise man brings himself under control.
- 12 If a ruler listens to lies, all of his officials are wicked.
- 13 The poor man and the oppressor have this in common: YHWH gives sight to the eyes of both.
- 14 The king who fairly judges the poor, his throne shall be established forever.
- 15 The rod of correction gives wisdom, but a child left to himself causes shame to his mother.
- 16 When the wicked increase, sin increases; but the righteous will see their downfall.
- 17 Correct your son, and he will give you peace; yes, he will bring delight to your soul.
- 18 Where there is no revelation, the people cast off restraint; but one who keeps the Torah is blessed.
- 19 A servant can't be corrected by words. Though he understands, yet he will not respond.
- 20 Do you see a man who is hasty in his words? There is more hope for a fool than for him.
- 21 He who pampers his servant from youth will have him become a son in the end.
- 22 An angry man stirs up strife, and a wrathful man abounds in sin.
- 23 A man's pride brings him low, but one of lowly spirit gains honor.
- 24 Whoever is an accomplice of a thief is an enemy of his own soul. He takes an oath, but dares not testify.
- 25 The fear of man proves to be a snare, but whoever puts his trust in YHWH is kept safe.
- 26 Many seek the ruler's favor, but a man's justice comes from YHWH!
- 27 A dishonest man detests the righteous, and the upright in their ways detest the wicked.
