1 Samuel 17:55-to-end,18:1-30.

- 55 When Saul saw David go forth against the Philistine, he said to Abner, the captain of the army, "Abner, whose son is this youth?" Abner said, "As your soul lives, O king, I can't tell."
- 56 The king said, "Inquire whose son the young man is!"
- 57 As David returned from the slaughter of the Philistine, Abner took him, and brought him before Saul with the head of the Philistine in his hand.
- 58 Saul said to him, "Whose son are you, you young man?" David answered, "I am the son of your servant Jesse the Bethlehemite."

1 ____. Saul Resents David. .___

It happened, when he had made an end of speaking to Saul, that the soul of Jonathan was knit with the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul.

- 2 Saul took him that day, and would let him go no more home to his father's house.
- 3 Then Jonathan and David made a covenant, because he loved him as his own soul.
- 4 Jonathan stripped himself of the robe that was on him, and gave it to David, and his clothing, even to his sword, and to his bow, and to his sash.
- 5 David went out wherever Saul sent him, and behaved himself wisely: and Saul set him over the men of war, and it was good in the sight of all the people, and also in the sight of Saul's servants.
- 6 It happened as they came, when David returned from the slaughter of the Philistine, that the women came out of all the cities of Israel, singing and dancing, to meet king Saul, with tambourines, with joy, and with instruments of music.
- 7 The women sang one to another as they played, and said, "Saul has slain his thousands, David his ten thousands."
- 8 Saul was very angry, and this saying displeased him; and he said, "They have ascribed to David ten thousands, and to me they have ascribed but thousands. What can he have more but the kingdom?"
- 9 Saul eved David from that day and forward.
- 10 It happened on the next day, that an evil spirit from ELOHIM came mightily on Saul, and he prophesied in the midst of the house. David played with his hand, as he did day by day. Saul had his spear in his hand;
- 11 and Saul threw the spear; for he said, "I will pin David even to the wall!" David escaped from his presence twice.
- 12 Saul was afraid of David, because YHWH was with him, and was departed from Saul.
- 13 Therefore Saul removed him from him, and made him his captain over a thousand; and he went out and came in before the people.
- 14 David behaved himself wisely in all his ways; and YHWH was with him.
- 15 When Saul saw that he behaved himself very wisely, he stood in awe of him.
- 16 But all Israel and Judah loved David; for he went out and came in before them.

Saul said to David, "Behold, my elder daughter Merab, I will give her to you as wife. Only be valiant for me, and fight YHWH's battles." For Saul said, "Don't let my hand be on him, but let the hand of the Philistines be on him."

- 18 David said to Saul, "Who am I, and what is my life, or my father's family in Israel, that I should be son-in-law to the king?"
- 19 But it happened at the time when Merab, Saul's daughter, should have been given to

David, that she was given to Adriel the Meholathite as wife.

- 20 Michal, Saul's daughter, loved David; and they told Saul, and the thing pleased him.
- 21 Saul said, I will give her to him, that she may be a snare to him, and that the hand of the Philistines may be against him. Therefore Saul said to David, "You shall this day be my son-in-law a second time."
- 22 Saul commanded his servants, "Talk with David secretly, and say, 'Behold, the king has delight in you, and all his servants love you: now therefore be the king's son-in-law."
- 23 Saul's servants spoke those words in the ears of David. David said, "Does it seems to you a light thing to be the king's son-in-law, since I am a poor man, and lightly esteemed?"
- 24 The servants of Saul told him, saying, "David spoke like this."
- 25 Saul said, "You shall tell David, 'The king desires no dowry except one hundred foreskins of the Philistines, to be avenged of the king's enemies." Now Saul thought to make David fall by the hand of the Philistines.
- 26 When his servants told David these words, it pleased David well to be the king's son-in-law. The days were not expired;
- 27 and David arose and went, he and his men, and killed of the Philistines two hundred men; and David brought their foreskins, and they gave them in full number to the king, that he might be the king's son-in-law. Saul gave him Michal his daughter as wife.
- 28 Saul saw and knew that YHWH was with David; and Michal, Saul's daughter, loved him.
- 29 Saul was yet the more afraid of David; and Saul was David's enemy continually.
- 30 Then the princes of the Philistines went forth: and it happened, as often as they went forth, that David behaved himself more wisely than all the servants of Saul; so that his name was highly esteemed.

Psalms 63.

1 ____. A Psalm of David when he was in the wilderness of Judah...

A Psalm by David, when he was in the desert of Judah. ELOHIM, you are my ELOHIM! I will earnestly seek you. My soul thirsts for you. My flesh longs for you, in a dry and weary land, where there is no water.

- 2 So I have seen you in the sanctuary, watching your power and your glory.
- 3 Because your loving kindness is better than life, my lips shall praise you.
- 4 So I will bless you while I live. I will lift up my hands in your name.
- 5 My soul shall be satisfied as with the richest food. My mouth shall praise you with joyful lips,
- 6 when I remember you on my bed, and think about you in the night watches.
- 7 For you have been my help. I will rejoice in the shadow of your wings.
- 8 My soul stays close to you. Your right hand holds me up.
- 9 But those who seek my soul, to destroy it, shall go into the lower parts of the earth.
- 10 They shall be given over to the power of the sword. They shall be jackal food.
- 11 But the king shall rejoice in ELOHIM! Everyone who swears by him will praise him, for the mouth of those who speak lies shall be silenced.

- 1 Wine is a mocker, and beer is a brawler. Whoever is led astray by them is not wise.
- 2 The terror of a king is like the roaring of a lion. He who provokes him to anger forfeits his own life.
- 3 It is an honor for a man to keep aloof from strife; but every fool will be quarreling.

- 15 There is gold and abundance of rubies; but the lips of knowledge are a rare jewel.
- 16 Take the garment of one who puts up collateral for a stranger; and hold him in pledge for a wayward woman.
- 17 Fraudulent food is sweet to a man, but afterwards his mouth is filled with gravel.
- 18 Plans are established by advice; by wise guidance you wage war!
- 19 He who goes about as a tale-bearer reveals secrets; therefore don't keep company with him who opens wide his lips.
- 20 Whoever curses his father or his mother, his lamp shall be put out in blackness of darkness.
- 21 An inheritance quickly gained at the beginning, won't be blessed in the end.
- 22 Don't say, "I will pay back evil." Wait for YHWH, and he will save you.
- 23 YHWH detests differing weights, and dishonest scales are not pleasing.
- 24 A man's steps are from YHWH; how then can man understand his way?
- 25 It is a snare to a man to make a rash dedication, then later to consider his yows.
- 26 A wise king winnows out the wicked, and drives the threshing wheel over them.
- 27 The spirit of man is YHWH's lamp, searching all his innermost parts.
- 28 Love and faithfulness keep the king safe. His throne is sustained by love.
- 29 The glory of young men is their strength. The splendor of old men is their gray hair.
- 30 Wounding blows cleanse away evil, and beatings purge the innermost parts.
