1 Chronicles 12, Zechariah 2, Psalms 49, Proverbs 2.

Day 230. 17-August Daily Reading (Prophets and Writings).

1 Chronicles 12.

1 . The Growth of David's Army. .

Now these are those who came to David to Ziklag, while he yet kept himself close because of Saul the son of Kish; and they were among the mighty men, his helpers in war.

- 2 They were armed with bows, and could use both the right hand and the left in slinging stones and in shooting arrows from the bow: they were of Saul's brothers of Benjamin.
- 3 The chief was Ahiezer; then Joash, the sons of Shemaah the Gibeathite, and Jeziel, and Pelet, the sons of Azmaveth, and Beracah, and Jehu the Anathothite,
- 4 and Ishmaiah the Gibeonite, a mighty man among the thirty, and over the thirty, and Jeremiah, and Jahaziel, and Yochanan, and Jozabad the Gederathite,
- 5 Eluzai, and Jerimoth, and Bealiah, and Shemariah, and Shephatiah the Haruphite,
- 6 Elkanah, and Isshiah, and Azarel, and Joezer, and Jashobeam, the Korahites,
- 7 and Joelah, and Zebadiah, the sons of Jeroham of Gedor.
- 8 Of the Gadites there separated themselves to David to the stronghold in the wilderness, mighty men of valor, men trained for war, that could handle shield and spear; whose faces were like the faces of lions, and they were as swift as the roes on the mountains;
- 9 Ezer the chief, Obadiah the second, Eliab the third,
- 10 Mishmannah the fourth, Jeremiah the fifth,
- 11 Attai the sixth, Eliel the seventh,
- 12 Yochanan the eighth, Elzabad the ninth,
- 13 Jeremiah the tenth, Machbannai the eleventh.
- 14 These of the sons of Gad were captains of the army: he who was least was equal to one hundred, and the greatest to one thousand.
- 15 These are those who went over the Jordan in the first month, when it had overflowed all its banks; and they put to flight all them of the valleys, both toward the east, and toward the west.
- 16 There came of the children of Benjamin and Judah to the stronghold to David.
- 17 David went out to meet them, and answered them, "If you have come peaceably to me to help me, my heart shall be knit to you; but if you have come to betray me to my adversaries, since there is no wrong in my hands, may the ELOHIM of our fathers look thereon, and rebuke it."
- 18 Then the Spirit came on Amasai, who was chief of the thirty, and he said, "We are yours, David, and on your side, you son of Jesse: peace, peace be to you, and peace be to your helpers; for your ELOHIM helps you." Then David received them, and made them captains of the band.
- 19 Of Manasseh also there fell away some to David, when he came with the Philistines against Saul to battle; but they didn't help them; for the masters of the Philistines sent him away after consultation, saying, "He will fall away to his master Saul to the jeopardy of our heads."
- 20 As he went to Ziklag, there fell to him of Manasseh, Adnah, and Jozabad, and Jediael, and Michael, and Jozabad, and Elihu, and Zillethai, captains of thousands who were of Manasseh.
- 21 They helped David against the band of rovers: for they were all mighty men of valor, and were captains in the army.
- 22 For from day to day men came to David to help him, until there was a great army, like the army of ELOHIM!

23 . David's Army at Hebron. .

1 Chronicles 12, Zechariah 2, Psalms 49, Proverbs 2.

These are the numbers of the heads of those who were armed for war, who came to David to Hebron, to turn the kingdom of Saul to him, according to the word of YHWH!

- 24 The children of Judah who bore shield and spear were six thousand and eight hundred, armed for war.
- 25 Of the children of Simeon, mighty men of valor for the war, seven thousand and one hundred.
- 26 Of the children of Levi four thousand and six hundred.
- 27 Jehoiada was the leader of the household of Aaron; and with him were three thousand and seven hundred,
- 28 and Zadok, a young man mighty of valor, and of his father's house twenty-two captains.
- 29 Of the children of Benjamin, the brothers of Saul, three thousand: for hitherto the greatest part of them had kept their allegiance to the house of Saul.
- 30 Of the children of Ephraim twenty thousand eight hundred, mighty men of valor, famous men in their fathers' houses.
- 31 Of the half-tribe of Manasseh eighteen thousand, who were mentioned by name, to come and make David king.
- 32 Of the children of Issachar, men who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do, their heads were two hundred; and all their brothers were at their commandment.
- 33 Of Zebulun, such as were able to go out in the army, who could set the battle in array, with all kinds of instruments of war, fifty thousand, and who could command and were not of double heart.
- 34 Of Naphtali one thousand captains, and with them with shield and spear thirty-seven thousand.
- 35 Of the Danites who could set the battle in array, twenty-eight thousand six hundred.
- 36 Of Asher, such as were able to go out in the army, who could set the battle in array, forty thousand.
- 37 On the other side of the Jordan, of the Reubenites, and the Gadites, and of the half-tribe of Manasseh, with all kinds of instruments of war for the battle, one hundred twenty thousand.
- 38 All these being men of war, who could order the battle array, came with a perfect heart to Hebron, to make David king over all Israel: and all the rest also of Israel were of one heart to make David king.
- 39 They were there with David three days, eating and drinking; for their brothers had made preparation for them.
- 40 Moreover those who were near to them, as far as Issachar and Zebulun and Naphtali, brought bread on donkeys, and on camels, and on mules, and on oxen, food of meal, cakes of figs, and clusters of raisins, and wine, and oil, and cattle, and sheep in abundance: for there was joy in Israel.

Zechariah 2.

1 . Vision of the Measuring Line. .

I lifted up my eyes, and saw, and behold, a man with a measuring line in his hand.

- 2 Then I asked, "Where are you going?" He said to me, "To measure Jerusalem, to see what is its breadth and what is its length."
- 3 Behold, the angel who talked with me went forth, and another angel went out to meet him.
- 4 and said to him, "Run, speak to this young man, saying, 'Jerusalem will be inhabited as villages without walls, because of the multitude of men and livestock in it.

5 For I,' says YHWH, 'will be to her a wall of fire around it, and I will be the glory in the midst of her.

. Future Joy of Zion and Many Nations. .

Come! Come! Flee from the land of the north,' says YHWH; 'for I have spread you abroad as the four winds of the sky,' says YHWH!

- 7 'Come, Zion! Escape, you who dwell with the daughter of Babylon.'
- 8 For thus says YHWH of Hosts: 'For honor he has sent me to the nations which plundered you; for he who touches you touches the apple of his eye.
- 9 For, behold, I will shake my hand over them, and they will be a spoil to those who served them; and you will know that YHWH of Hosts has sent me.
- 10 Sing and rejoice, daughter of Zion; for, behold, I come, and I will dwell in the midst of you,' says YHWH!
- 11 Many nations shall join themselves to YHWH in that day, and shall be my people; and I will dwell in the midst of you, and you shall know that YHWH of Hosts has sent me to you.
- 12 YHWH will inherit Judah as his portion in the holy land, and will again choose Jerusalem.
- 13 Be silent, all flesh, before YHWH; for he has roused himself from his holy habitation!"

Psalms 49.

1 . To the Chief Musician. A Psalm of the sons of Korah...

For the Chief Musician. A Psalm by the sons of Korah. Hear this, all you peoples. Listen, all you inhabitants of the world,

- 2 both low and high, rich and poor together.
- 3 My mouth will speak words of wisdom. My heart shall utter understanding.
- 4 I will incline my ear to a proverb. I will open my riddle on the harp.
- 5 Why should I fear in the days of evil, when iniquity at my heels surrounds me?
- 6 Those who trust in their wealth, and boast in the multitude of their riches
- 7 none of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give ELOHIM a ransom for him.
- 8 For the redemption of their life is costly, no payment is ever enough,
- 9 That he should live on forever, that he should not see corruption.
- 10 For he sees that wise men die; likewise the fool and the senseless perish, and leave their wealth to others.
- 11 Their inward thought is that their houses will endure forever, and their dwelling places to all generations. They name their lands after themselves.
- 12 But man, despite his riches, doesn't endure. He is like the animals that perish.
- 13 This is the destiny of those who are foolish, and of those who approve their sayings. Selah.
- 14 They are appointed as a flock for Sheol. Death shall be their shepherd. The upright shall have dominion over them in the morning. Their beauty shall decay in Sheol, far from their mansion.
- 15 But ELOHIM will redeem my soul from the power of Sheol, for he will receive me. Selah.
- 16 Don't be afraid when a man is made rich, when the glory of his house is increased.
- 17 For when he dies he shall carry nothing away. His glory shall not descend after him.
- 18 Though while he lived he blessed his soul and men praise you when you do well for yourself

- 19 he shall go to the generation of his fathers. They shall never see the light.
- 20 A man who has riches without understanding, is like the animals that perish.

Proverbs 2.

1 . The Value of Wisdom. .

My son, if you will receive my words, and store up my commandments within you;

- 2 So as to turn your ear to wisdom, and apply your heart to understanding;
- 3 Yes, if you call out for discernment, and lift up your voice for understanding;
- 4 If you seek her as silver, and search for her as for hidden treasures:
- 5 then you will understand the fear of YHWH, and find the knowledge of ELOHIM!
- 6 For YHWH gives wisdom. Out of his mouth comes knowledge and understanding.
- 7 He lays up sound wisdom for the upright. He is a shield to those who walk in integrity;
- 8 that he may guard the paths of justice, and preserve the way of his holy ones.
- 9 Then you will understand righteousness and justice, equity and every good path.
- 10 For wisdom will enter into your heart. Knowledge will be pleasant to your soul.
- 11 Discretion will watch over you. Understanding will keep you,
- 12 to deliver you from the way of evil, from the men who speak perverse things;
- 13 who forsake the paths of uprightness, to walk in the ways of darkness;
- 14 who rejoice to do evil, and delight in the perverseness of evil;
- 15 who are crooked in their ways, and wayward in their paths:
- 16 To deliver you from the strange woman, even from the foreigner who flatters with her words:
- 17 who forsakes the friend of her youth, and forgets the covenant of her ELOHIM:
- 18 for her house leads down to death, her paths to the dead.
- 19 None who go to her return again, neither do they attain to the paths of life:
- 20 that you may walk in the way of good men, and keep the paths of the righteous.
- 21 For the upright will dwell in the land. The perfect will remain in it.
- 22 But the wicked will be cut off from the land. The treacherous will be rooted out of it.
